The funeral of Mr. Thomas William Mews took place on Friday, at Wesleyan Cemetery, East Perth. The deceased was a very old colonist, having arrived in the State with his parents by the ship Rockingham, in 1830. After residing in Perth for a number of years, he removed to Fremantle, and started in business as a boatbuilder. At the time of his death, which took place in his ninetieth year, deceased resided in Ada-street, South Fremantle. He was twice married, and his second wife predeceased him some years ago. Boy Descendants of Pioneers to Hoist Foundation Day Flag

TODAY three boys attending the Fremantle Boys' School and who are descendants of pioneers, were selected to hoist the flag at the Foundation Day observance at the Fremantle Esplanade on June 3. They are Frank Flindell, of 77 Samson-street, Beaconsfield; Graham Smith, 32 Dalgety-street, East Fremantle; and Arthur Jarman, Angwin street, East Fremantle. Originally it was intended to select the boy with the oldest Western Australian ancestry, but as all three lads had equal claims, the Mayor of Fremantle (Mr. F. E. Gibson), Cr. F. Hollis and the Town Clerk (Mr. J. Shepherd), after conferring with the head-master of the school (Mr. A. W. Senior) decided that all three boys should participate in the ceremony. Flindell's ancestors - the Gee family - arrived in the windjammer Caroline in 1829. Caroline Gee, a daughter of the pioneers, was born in Perth in 1833, and later married John Truslove, who arrived in Western Australia at the age of 18 months in the sailing ship Skerne in January, 1820. Ellen Truslove, their daughter, married M. C. Flindell, whose son (Mr. H. J.G. Flindell) is Frank Flindell's father; The boy is, therefore, the great-grandson of

*the late John and Caroline Truslove. **Graham Smith is a descendant of Thomas William Mews, who arrived in Western Australia in the windjammer Rockingham in 1829, accompanied by his parents. Direct descendants of Thomas William Mews still living are Robert Mews (son), aged 75, of Sinclair-street, South Fremantle; Mrs. Julia Allpike (daughter), aged 78, of Wardie-street. South Fremantle, and Mrs. Emma Dean (daughter), aged more than 80, who resides at Subiaco. Thomas William Mews is the mater-nal great-grandfather of Graham Smith. LATE MR. JAMES ROBERT MEWS.

The funeral of another old colonist in the person of the late Mr. James Robert Mews, of 132 Palmerston-st, Perth, took place on Wednesday afternoon. Deceased (the youngest son of the late Mr. Thomas W. Mews, senr., the well-known shipwright) was born at Perth and had resided in this State the whole of the 85 years of his life. For many years he was well and favourably known as a contractor, but failing health necessitated his retirement from active life for some years past. A widow and grown-up family of three sons and two daughters survive him. The cortege moved from his late residence, 132 Palmerston-street, Perth, and proceeded by road to the Anglican portion of the Karrakatta Cemetery, where the remains were laid to rest, the Rev. J. P. DEATH OF AN OLD PIONEER.

LATE MR. THOMAS W. MEWS.

The colonisation and early settlement of this State is recalled by the death of Mr. Thomas William Mews, who passed away at South Fremantle on June 20 at the age of 82 years.

Mr. Mews's father, who bore the same name as the deceased, arrived in this State in the ship Rockingham in 1829, at the age of 14 years. This was the ship chartered by Mr. Thomas Peel, who brought out with him a number of settlers and took up the land which is now known as the Peel Estate, with such disastrous results. It was the last voyage of the Rockingham, as she went ashore at Cockburn Sound, was tugged off by a man-of-war, taken to what is now known as Careening Bay to be careened, capsized, and was lost. The deceased was born in this State, and spent most of his life in Fremantle. He was a shipbuilder of no mean ability, and built about 12 schooners for Messrs. J. and W. Bateman, notable amongst them being the Star (90 tons), Myra, and Lone. The vessels were used in the coastal trade of Western Australia, and occasionally went as far as Adelaide. Some years ago he was included in an exploration expedition led by Mr. Harding, whose object it was to discover suitable pastoral country near Roebuck Bay. Messrs. Harding, Panther, and Goldwyr, during the expedition, left camp and never returned. It was necessary to have a small boat to proceed along the coast to search around the various creeks and water courses, etc., for the missing men. Although he only possessed a crosscut saw and an axe, Mr. Mews obtained the necessary timber from the forest and built a boat. The missing men were murdered by the natives, and their bodies were discovered later.

For a number of years Mr. Mews had been living in retirement at 14 Sydney-street, South Fremantle. One son, three daughters, 11 grandchildren, and one great grandchild survive him. Out of respect for the deceased the flag was at half-mast on the Fremantle Town Hall yesterday when the funeral took place. The remains were interred privately in the Presbyterian portion of the Fremantle Cemetery. The last rites were conducted by the Rev. J. Marshall. Relatives present at the graveside were Messrs. THE LATE MAJOR SHERWOOD.

After an illness extending over the past ten days, and following on a serious operation, Major Thomas Sherwood, one of the most highly respected citizens of the State, died, at the age of 76 years, at Miss Moore's private hospital, "Kareenya," St. George's-terrace, early on the afternoon of July 30. From the time of Major Sherwood's admission to the institution, little hope was entertained of his ultimate restoration to health, and the news of his demise occasioned but little surprise among his wide circle of friends. The deceased, who was born in Dorsetshire, England, on January 24, 1838, was the son of the late Mr. Frederick Sherwood, an architect and surveyor in the early days of the State. He came to Western Australia at the early age of five years, arriving with his parents in the brig Lady Gray (Captain Hawkes commander) on January 4, 1843. In 1855 he entered the Imperial Commissariat Department in a clerical capacity, and when in 1875 the transfer of the Convict Department to the Crown colony by the Imperial Government was being effected, he was transferred to the office of chief clerk and accountant of stores, which appointment he held until the completion of the transfer in 1886. Later Major Sherwood joined the Lands Department, and there saw 17 years of continued service. His association with the local military forces commenced in 1861, when he joined the first Volunteer Corps formed in Western Australia under Colonel Bruce, then Commandant of the Forces. After serving in the ranks as a non-commissioned officer, he received his first commission as Lieutenant in the Metropolitan Rifle Volunteers in 1875, a corps which passed through many changes, and is now known as the 88th Infantry Regiment. At the end of 34 years, he retired with the rank of Major, to which he had previously received promotion, and was the recipient of the volunteer officer's decoration in 1894. The deceased was for long associated with the Anglican Church, and held the posts, in turn, of diocesan secretary, diocesan treasurer, and trustee. He was in the early days a yachtsman of note, and also won honours in the cricket field. He was, moreover, one of the leaders of Freemasonry in Western Australia being initiated in the lodge of St. John No. 485 E.C. on July 23, 1886, and was Worshipful Master in 1872 and again in 1875. He became district junior grand warden under the English Constitution in 1889, and district senior grand warden in 1892, being also created Past Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Western Australia in 1903. The late Major Sherwood was married in August, 1862, to Miss Caroline Mews, of Perth, and there are eleven children - six sons and five daughters. The deceased was also a justice of the peace for the whole of the State for very many years.

A Good Citizen.

Although no longer on the 'active list' of our public officers, Mr. Aubrey Thomas Sherwood is a well-known citizen, who was born in this State. Perth was his birthplace in 1865, and many, are the interesting associations he can recall, while his stories of the progress of his native capital and Western Australia are also captivating. Educated in Fremantle and at the High School (Hale), Perth, he commenced life in the Customs Department, Fremantle. at the age of 18, and for well over 40 years his connection with this section of the State and Federal public service was never broken. In 1890 Mr. Sherwood, after passing through every branch of the Customs business, was selected to open the Customs House in Perth, and in 1895 he was appointed sub-collector, a position he occupied for about 30 years. Outside his business activities he devoted most of his leisure hours to aquatic sports, and as a yachtsman no one has been better known on the Swan River for many years. His boat was the Lotus, which won him many prizes. He- was one of the founders of the Freshwater Bay Yacht Club, of which he was hon. secretary, and several times commodore, vice-president, and president. Mr. Sherwood is also a well known member of the Claremont Yacht Club. Golf, too, has had his support, the Cottesloe links being his rendezvous for this ancient game. Another interest to which he has given much time is Freemasonry, and he is one of the oldest members of the Masonic Club, Perth, where his father before him, the late Major Thos. Sherwood, was a distinguished patron.

James Forrest Fowler

Another of the earlier pioneers of Western Australia, viz, James Forrest Fowler, whose past associations with the land embraced properties in the Preston Valley and 14 Mile Brook, died in St. John of God Hospital on Feb-ruary 26 last at the age of 90 years. The late Mr. Fowler purchased the property known as Congeling Park, following the death of the late Mr. Whitford in 1926, and with the capable assistance of his two sons Aubrey and Tom, it was converted into a large estate and subsequently became noted for the production of high quality clover seed which has a keen demand throughout the Commonwealth. The deceased was a capable, enterprising landholder, with wide experience in all branches of farming and grazing. He retired from active association with the property at Congeling in 1939 and was living at Dalkeith where his wife predeceased him about four years ago. In addition to Tom and Aubrey, there are two other children remaining, viz, Phyllis and Nancy. The deceased leaves a fine record as a pioneer coupled with outstanding characteristics which marked him as a man of the highest moral principles. In this respect his qualities awakened the ut-most respect of all who were privileged to know him and we feel sure that this will serve to maintain happy memories of his past association with the district in which he was justly honored and respected.
